### QUALIFICATIONS FOR ADMISSION

1. Bachelor's degree in any field from the institutions accredited by the Ministry of Education, Thailand
2. A minimum CGPA of 2.50 on 4.00 scale

### APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

1. A completed application form
2. Official transcript of the previous university attended (1 copy)
3. Bachelor's degree certificate (1 copy)
4. Citizen identification card and house registration (1 copy) - for Thai applicants
5. Passport (1 copy) - for Non-Thai applicants
6. One (1x1.5 inches) photograph (formal attire, not in graduation gown)

For overseas graduates, all documents submitted at time of application must be translated and certified, attested, or notarized with official seal or stamp from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Education or related department.

### ENTRANCE EXAMINATION

### Exemption

The AU English Proficiency Test can be exempted depending on which of the following conditions you satisfy.

- a TOEFL score of (iBT) 90 or an IELTS (Academic) score of at least 6.5 (Validation: Two years)
- a Bachelor's degree from native English speaking countries (USA, Canada, UK, New Zealand and Australia)

- Have the independent study/part of the independent study published in any retrievable form
- Have obtained library and financial clearance with the University
- Have demonstrated good behavior and discipline
